



**Food Truck Food Court Performer Guidelines
May through October, 2020**

Food Truck Food Court takes place every Thursday, from April through October. This is a lunchtime event, with food trucks serving from 11:00 AM – 2:00 PM. We are proud to host the best food trucks in Columbus and give people from all across Columbus a lunch break unlike any other.

Below are the guidelines specific to performers at Food Truck Food Court at Columbus Commons:

- Performers must be prepared to perform from 11:00 AM – 1:30 PM.
- Food Truck Food Court is a rain or shine event, but performances may be canceled in the event of poor weather. This call is made at the discretion of Columbus Commons staff by 9:00 AM on performance days. No fee will be provided to performers if Columbus Commons staff provides email, phone, or text notification by 9:00 AM on the performance day, but an effort will be made to reschedule.
- Performance will take place in the “Bosque” area of Columbus Commons. The Bosque is at the south end of the park, between E. Rich St. and the Carousel. In most circumstances, a 10’x20’ tent will be provided by Columbus Commons. If your act allows, strolling performances are welcome.
- Music may be acoustic or amplified. Columbus Commons will provide power. If power is required, a detailed equipment list must be sent to Columbus Commons two weeks before the performance.
- Loading area will be provided at bagged parking meters along the north side of E. Rich St., across the street from 55 E. Rich. A helpful tip is to navigate to 54 E. Rich St.
- Parking at the Columbus Commons Main Garage (55 E. Rich St.) will be provided, up to one pass per musician. Check in with Columbus Commons staff to receive validation. You may park before checking in; validation is needed upon exit of the parking garage.
- Ensembles can be any size; if an ensemble exceeds four performers, special considerations may need to be in place. However, the fee will be the same regardless of ensemble size. Preference is given to ensembles with 2-3 performers.
- Solicitation of tips is not acceptable.
- Performers may offer CDs and/or merchandise for sale.
- Performers may bring signage with their ensemble’s branding. This should be approved in advance as wind and other weather may cause our staff to remove the signage.
- Columbus Commons may use photos or videos of the performances for promotional purposes.
